The Young American Creative Patriotic Art, 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art, Patriot's Pen Essay, and Voice of Democracy Audio Essay Contests, which each give young people the opportunity to receive recognition and earn awards at various levels of competition by demonstrating their patriotism through their artistic or writing talents, are all part of our Scholarships Program. The National VFW Auxiliary also provides scholarships for Auxiliary members and adult members of their immediate family through its Continuing Education Scholarship Program. It is the goal of the VFW Auxiliary Scholarships Program to assist students in attaining an education, reaching their full potential, and making their dreams come true.

Let's promote participation in all of these programs by strongly publicizing them within our communities and, in doing so, educating the public about the values of the VFW and its Auxiliary. Announce your Scholarships Programs through social media, in area newspapers, on local cable channels, in area libraries, in the newsletters of area churches and civic groups, on bulletin boards and electric sign boards in public buildings and local businesses, and especially at locations frequented by young people.

The VFW Auxiliary presents one **Continuing Education Scholarship** each year to a selected candidate in each of the four VFW Auxiliary Conferences to assist those who wish to further their education by pursuing a college degree or career direction at a vocational/ technical school. Only current VFW Auxiliary members, their spouse, daughter, or son with a financial need are eligible to apply. The applicant must be twenty-one years of age or older and the qualifying member must have been a member of the VFW Auxiliary for one full year prior to the application submission deadline.

To apply for the \$1,250 scholarship, a completed VFW Auxiliary National Continuing Education Scholarship Application form, typed answers on a separate piece of paper to all questions listed on that application, and an essay of 300 words or less describing their commitment to their goals and how this scholarship will help them attain these goals must all be mailed directly to the Program Awards Administrator, VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters, 406 W. 34th Street 10th Floor, Kansas City MO 64111 or emailed to <a href="mailto:info@vfwauxiliary.org">info@vfwauxiliary.org</a> with the following subject line: Continuing Education Scholarship Application in time for them to be received no later than 15 February 2025.

Students who are enrolled in a public, private, or parochial school or a home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions, or are dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools may enter our youth Scholarships Contests. Although U.S. Citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application for which has not been denied) and intend to become a U.S. citizen at the earliest opportunity allowed by law. Foreign exchange students, students aged 20 or over, GED or Adult

Education students, or previous Department winners of one these contests who received a National award in that contest are ineligible to enter that same contest.

Students in grades nine through twelve by the 31 March 2025 deadline who meet the criteria listed above should be encouraged to enter an original, two-dimensional art entry done on canvas or paper into our Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest. Watercolor, pencil, pastel, charcoal, tempera, crayon, acrylic, pen, ink, oil, marker, or other media may be used. Canvas entries should be submitted on a stretcher frame or canvas board. The piece should not be framed. Mats, including mounted and floating mats, may be used. It is highly recommended that heavy paper be used to reinforce the back of an entry. The art should be no smaller than 8 inches by 10 inches or larger than 18 inches by 24 inches, including the mat.

Our first place Department winning Young American Creative Patriotic Art piece will be entered into the National VFW Auxiliary competition where scholarships of \$15,000 for first place, \$7,500 for second place, \$3,500 for third place, \$1,500 each for fourth and fifth places, \$1,000 each for sixth and seventh places, and \$500 each for eighth through nineteenth places will be awarded to the winners.

Eligible students in grades nine through twelve should also be encouraged to enter an original, three-dimensional art piece into the separate patriotic art contest called the **3-Dimensional Patriotic Art Contest.** The three-dimensional art can be paper, papier-mâché, pottery, sculpture, fabric, wood, metalwork, etc. Entries should be no larger than 18 inches in any direction. The art may not weigh more than 5 pounds.

The 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art Contest has its own scholarship amounts. The National Awards are \$2,500 for first place, \$1,500 for second place, \$1,000 for third place, and \$500 for fourth place.

Digital art, photography, weapons, art generated by 3-D printer, and jewelry are not acceptable in either patriotic art contest.

If the American Flag is used in the entry in either contest, it must conform to the Federal Flag Code as far as colors, number of stars and stripes, and other pertinent rules of the code. Federal Flag Code information is available at <a href="https://www.military.com/flag-day/us-flag-code.html">https://www.military.com/flag-day/us-flag-code.html</a>.

Each art entry should have been done during the current (2024-2025) school year. Both the proper, completed Official Patriotic Art Contest Scholarship Entry Form bearing information about the artist, the signature of his parent/guardian, the source of the idea for his artwork, and the media used in the entry and a typed explanation of the entry (250 words or less) must be submitted with the entry. The typed explanation of the 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art entry should include the steps taken to create it.

Those selected to be judges of the Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest or the 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art Contest entries on all levels of competition should be

teachers, professionals, and persons knowledgeable about art. Comments of the judges should be attached and forwarded with the art. Each entry will be judged on the originality of concept, presentation, and patriotism expressed; content of how it relates to patriotism and clarity of ideas; design technique; and total impact of work.

Students entering one or both of the Patriotic Art Contests must submit their entry to a local Auxiliary Scholarships Chairman by Monday, 31 March 2025.

There is no District level of judging for either art scholarship contest. I must receive the winning Auxiliary first place entries no later than 15 April 2025 for them to be included in the Department level of competition. I shall submit our Department first place winning entry in each contest into the National level of competition.

National winning entries in each Patriotic Art Contest will be shown on VFW Auxiliary social media pages and displayed at the VFW Auxiliary National Convention.

"My Voice in America's Democracy?" is the 2024-2025 theme of our VFW and VFW Auxiliary Patriot's Pen Written Essay Competition which is open to students in grades six through eight who meet the eligibility requirements for all our youth Scholarships contests. This competition is approved by the National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP).

Essay contest entries should be typewritten in English with no color or graphics and cannot be less than 300 words or more than 400 words in length (+ or - 5 words max). Every word is counted regardless of length. The essay title (theme) or added footnotes do not contribute to the word count. The essay must be the contestant's original work and a product of the contestant's own thinking. The approach to the Patriot's Pen theme should be positive and clearly focused. Poetry is not acceptable. Quotations may be used sparingly if plainly identified wherever used. Contestants may not identify themselves within their essay (including, but not limited to, their name, school, city, state, race, or national origin) or put their name on their essay. A completed 2024-2025 Official Patriot's Pen Entry Form should be stapled to the top of the essay. Patriot's Pen Essay Competition entries should be submitted to the Patriot's Pen Chairman of a VFW Post no later than midnight on 31 October 2024. Contestants will be judged on the basis of their essay alone and are not required to present the essay orally. Patriot's Pen judging will be based on knowledge of the theme (30%), theme development (35%), and clarity of ideas (35%).

"Is America Today Our Forefathers' Vision?" is the 2024-2025 theme of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and its Auxiliary Voice of Democracy Scholarship Program. Students in grades nine through twelve who meet the eligibility requirements for our youth Scholarships contests should be encouraged to enter this wonderful patriotic audio essay competition which is also approved by the NASSP.

To enter the competition students should write and then record their original three-to-five minute (+ or - 5 second max) audio essay on a flash drive or other electronic

device and submit it along with a typed copy of their essay with a completed 2024-2025 Official Voice of Democracy Competition Entry Form attached to a VFW Post by midnight on Thursday, 31 October 2024. An emailed entry form, essay, and attached audio file may be submitted to the VFW Post with prior approval from that Post. The flash drive/USB and typed essay should be labeled with the entrant's name, but the entrant cannot be identified in any way within the recording (including, but not limited to, his name, school, city, state, race, or national origin). No music, singing, poetry, or sound effects are permitted on the recording. Judging of Voice of Democracy entries will be based on originality (30%), content (35%), and delivery (35%).

Inappropriate use of ChatGPT or other AI tools is not allowed in either contest.

Rules of both the Patriot's Pen and Voice of Democracy Competitions allow a Post with its Auxiliary to advance one (1) winning entry to District for every fifteen (15) entries or fraction thereof received in their local competition. Only one (1) winning District entry with a head and shoulders photo of the District winner is to be submitted to the Department VFW.

The first place Department winning entry in each competition will be submitted into the National VFW Competition. There are fifty-three National Patriot's Pen Awards totaling \$55,000. Those range from \$5,000 for first place down to \$500 for fifty-third place. There is a total of \$171,000 in National Voice of Democracy Scholarships ranging from \$35,000 for first place down to \$1,000 for fifty-third place. Therefore, each Department winner in these two contests will receive a National award.

Young American Creative Patriotic Art, 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art, Patriot's Pen, and Voice of Democracy Competition rules state that a student may submit only one entry into each competition. Be sure to thoroughly read all Scholarships Program materials in this book for additional details and requirements of each contest.

The Department of Massachusetts VFW Auxiliary presents monetary awards to the state winners in each of these contests. The awards come from the Bessie Hanken Youth Awards Fund, so all Auxiliaries are asked to donate as generously as you possibly can to this fund. Individual contributions would also be greatly appreciated. In memoriam donations and donations in lieu of birthday, holiday, and congratulatory gifts traditionally given to family, friends, or co-workers contributed to the Bessie Hanken Youth Awards Fund will not only serve to reward young people for their accomplishments but also honor those in whose name the donation is made.

A \$200 first place award and a \$100 second place award will be given to the state winners in each of our Auxiliary sponsored Young American Creative Patriotic Art and 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art Contests.

In addition to the prizes awarded by the Department of Massachusetts VFW to the state winners in the Patriot's Pen Competition, the Department Auxiliary presents \$200 for first place, \$150 for second place, \$100 for third place, \$75 for fourth place, and \$50

for fifth place. Our awards to the state winners in the Voice of Democracy Competition are \$500 for first place, \$300 for second place, \$200 for third place, \$150 for fourth place, and \$100 for fifth place.

Donations through National to the Patriotic Art and the Continuing Education Scholarship Escrow Funds are needed. The goals of these funds are to increase the number and amounts of the Young American Creative Patriotic Art and 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art Scholarships awarded at the national level and to increase the award amount of the Continuing Education Scholarship from \$1,250 to \$2,500, respectively. Auxiliaries and individual members are asked to make donations to these two scholarship escrow funds to make these goals realities. To donate by mail, send a check earmarked either Patriotic Art or Continuing Education to: VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters, Attn.: Scholarship Fund, 406 W. 34th Street 10th Floor, Kansas City MO 64111. Donations may also be made online in MALTA by selecting "Make A Gift" and then entering the amount you choose to donate in the field next to the fund to which you choose to donate, followed by your payment information.

The National VFW Auxiliary is offering Scholarships Program Awards to Auxiliaries that host an activity and/or event educating their community about the scholarship opportunities through the VFW and the VFW Auxiliary. It will send a citation to every Auxiliary that hosts an activity and/or event educating their community about scholarship opportunities through the VFW and the VFW Auxiliary and submits a completed Scholarships National Program Awards 2024-2025 Entry Form to me by 31 March 2025. I shall sign and forward the form to National Headquarters. The National Auxiliary will also award \$25.00 to one Auxiliary in each of the four (4) Conferences with the most outstanding activity and/or event educating their community about scholarship opportunities through the VFW and the VFW Auxiliary.

## **COMMON MISTAKES & HELPFUL HINTS**

The VFW Auxiliary's Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contest & 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art Contest provide an incredible scholarship opportunity for young artists while promoting patriotism throughout schools and home school associations. Follow the advice below to ensure that every student who enters the contest has the best possible chance of realizing his or her dreams.



#### **USING THE U.S. FLAG**

As a powerful symbol of our country, the U.S. Flag is often used in art entries. It can also be a source of problems for judges and Auxiliary Chairmen. When notifying schools, homeschool associations and students about the contest, give them a copy of the Federal Flag Code and encourage participants to closely examine the U.S. Flag before using it in their art.

#### **COMMON MISTAKES:**


- Not enough stars or stripes.
- Stripes in the wrong order or place.
- The Flag appearing to have someone standing on it, or something written or lying

**HINT:** It is always best to portray the Flag as waving freely.

## **APPLICATION** (One application for each contest)

When a student submits an art entry and contest application, check for the following:

- Print or legible writing. If you can't decipher the writing, chances are we can't either.
- Address with city, state and ZIP code.
- Phone number with area code.
- Email address. This is used for all notifications.
- Signature of both student and parent or guardian.
- Source- this must be complete even if it states "original idea."
- Media used.
- Title of art entry.
- An artist statement, essay and detailed description of the art entry and how it was made.
- Signatures of participating/sponsoring VFW Auxiliary Scholarships Chairman and Department Scholarships Chairman.
- Art entries not sponsored by a VFW Auxiliary will not be judged and will be returned to the student.



#### **PACKING THE ART**

VFW Auxiliary National Headquarters is not responsible for art lost or damaged during shipment. Please take in consideration that the art entry may be very fragile and will be shipped over many miles and encounter weather condition's.

- Use the correct size packaging.
- Use paper, bubble wrap, air pillows, cushioning and/or foam shippers.
- Label the package clearly to insure deadline arrival.

#### What is the Patriot's Pen Program?

Conducted nationwide, this VFW-sponsored youth essay competition gives students an opportunity to write essays expressing their views on an annual patriotic theme. We invite you to join the more than  $\bar{7}3,000$  students who participated last year in this contest.

#### Why Should I Enter?

Prizes and scholarships can be awarded at the Post, District, State and national level. Department (State) winners receive a portion of \$55,000 in national awards. National Winners will receive at least \$500. The first-place national award is currently \$5,000.

The Internal Revenue Service requires a recipient awarded more than \$599 be given Form 1099 identifying the proceeds as taxable income. This may require the winner to provide their social security number.

#### **How Does the Contest Work?**

All entries begin at the VFW Post level. The only exception is where schools/classes/youth groups have large numbers of students and wish to conduct their own competition, submitting one winner for each 15 students to the VFW Post. Individual students may submit their entry directly to the Post.

The contest consists of four levels. The first level (entry) is sponsored by VFW Posts. Post winners advance, one for every 15 entries, to the VFW District (regional) level where the one first-place winner is advanced to the VFW Department (state) level. The first-place winner at the Department level is then advanced into the VFW national competition.

#### Who Can Enter?

Patriot's Pen is open to 6th, 7th and 8th-grade students enrolled by the Oct. 31 deadline in public, private or parochial schools in the U.S., its territories or its possessions; or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. Home-schooled students also are eligible. Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen at the earliest opportunity allowed by law. (Foreign exchange students are ineligible.)

#### How Do I Get Started?

- Ask a teacher or youth group/club adult leader to supervise the Patriot's Pen writing contest.
- Contact a participating VFW Post and indicate your interest in participating.

- Establish a contact person who is a member of that VFW Post or its VFW Auxiliary.
- Make sure that your essay is submitted to the VFW Post before the contest deadline of October 31, 2024. You can submit your essay and entry form by email upon the Post's approval. Entries sent to the VFW National Headquarters directly will be returned.

#### How Am I Judged?

#### Knowledge of the theme is worth 30 points:

You must show a thorough knowledge of the theme in your work. Demonstrate you have researched the issue extensively.

#### Theme development is worth 35 points:

Answer all relevant facts about the theme such as the who, what, where, when and why. Relate the theme to your own experiences.

#### Clarity of ideas is worth 35 points:

Write your essay in an easy-to-understand format. Leave your reader with a clear understanding of your explanation of the theme.

#### What Is the Theme?

VFW's Commander-in-Chief annually chooses the year's theme. The 2024-2025 theme is:

"My Voice in America's Democracy?"

#### Deadline Information.

To qualify, all entries must be submitted to a sponsoring VFW Post by midnight October 31, 2024.



#### What is the Voice of Democracy Program?

Since 1947, the Voice of Democracy has been the Veterans of Foreign Wars' (VFW's) premier scholarship program. Each year, nearly 27,000 high school students compete for more than \$2 million in scholarships and incentives. Students compete by writing and recording an audio essay on an annual patriotic theme. This year's theme is, "Is America Today Our Forefathers' Vision?"

#### Why Should | Enter?

Prizes and scholarships can be awarded at the Post, District, state and national level. Department (State) winners receive an all-expense-paid trip to Washington DC, to tour the city, be honored by the VFW and its Auxiliary and receive their portion of \$171,000 in national awards, the top scholarship being \$35,000.

#### The Rules

#### Who can enter?

The Voice of Democracy is open to students in grades 9-12 by the Oct. 31 deadline who are enrolled in a public, private or parochial high school or home study program in the United States, its territories and possessions; or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools. Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application for which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen at the earliest opportunity allowed by law. Foreign exchange students, students age 20 or over, GED or Adult Education Students are ineligible.

#### What do I need to enter?

Record your original 3-5 minute (+ or - 5 second max.) audio essay on a flash drive, or other electronic device. You will submit the recording, typed essay and this completed entry form. Provide these items to your school/group competition or VFW Post for judging. In addition you can submit your emailed entry form, essay, and audio file to the VFW Post upon approval. You must be the sole author of your essay. Inappropriate use of ChatGPT or or other AI tools is not allowed. The recording must be in your own voice and in English. Hearing/speech impaired students should email the Voice of Democracy National Office at youthscholarships@vfw.org for special instructions. No music, singing, poetry or sound effects are allowed. The body of the essay must not identify you in any way, (including, but not limited to your name, school, city, state, race, or national origin) although the recording & typed essay should be labeled with your name, to show ownership.

#### Where Do I Submit My Entry?

All entries begin at the VFW Post level. The only exception is where schools/classes/youth groups have large numbers of students and wish to conduct their own competition, submitting one winner for each 15 students to the VFW Post. Individual students may submit their entry directly to the Post. Entries sent to VFW National will be returned. One winner for every 15 entries from each Post advances to District and one District winner advances to the state (Department) competition. Clearly express your ideas in an organized manner. Fully develop your theme and use transitions to move smoothly from one idea to another.

#### Delivery is worth 35 points:

Speak in a clear and credible manner.





## Military Assistance Program Grant Guidelines

#### Purpose:

To provide financial assistance to VFW Posts/Depts. and Auxiliaries who sponsor events with their local military community. These funds are meant to build relationships and provide information on VFW programs and services.

#### MAP Grant Criteria:

- Only a VFW or Auxiliary member may submit a MAP Grant Application.
- 2. The application must be signed and dated by the Post/Dept. Commander, Quartermaster or the Auxiliary President or Treasurer.
- Post participation in programs will be verified.
- 4. The grant is limited to basic food items and non-alcoholic beverages for currently serving military and their family members only. Grants cannot exceed \$5000 per fiscal year (Sept. 1 Aug. 31). Events cooked and served by the Post are \$8 per person, catered meals are \$10 per person.

#### Grant does not cover equipment or venue rentals, gifts, decorations, entertainment, etc.

- Must have and explain recruitment plan for event.
- 6. The grant does not cover public or formal events such as: Military Dining In/Out, Military Balls, Change of Command/Responsibility Ceremonies, etc.
- 7. The grant application must be submitted no earlier than 14 days prior to the event. Any exceptions to this must be submitted in writing to the Director VFW Programs for approval.
- 8. An After Action Report along with eligible receipts must be submitted within 14 days of the event. Non submission will result in the Dept./Post/Auxiliary being billed for the grant amount.
- 9. If the event receipts total less that the grant amount provided, the Dept./Post/Auxiliary will be required to refund the difference within 14 days.
- 10. If the event is cancelled a full refund is required. If rescheduled for a later date, a written explanation must be submitted to the MAP office detailing the new dates. It will be determined by the MAP office and VFW Program Director whether a refund will be requested or the Dept./Post/Auxiliary will be allowed to keep the grant amount.

11. MAP Grants must be submitted through the following form:

12. MAP Grant Reporting must be submitted through the following form:

MAP Grant Report

Note: Prior approval of similar events does not guarantee future approval. An AAU Report must be submitted prior to requesting a new MAP Grant.

### **Unmet Needs Program FAQ**

#### What does the Unmet Needs Program do?

 Unmet Needs provides grants (not loans) and referrals to other organizations to activeduty service members and their immediate families to assist with daily necessities.

#### Who is eligible to receive assistance?

- Service members who are currently serving on active duty (to include activated Guard/Reserve members) whose financial hardship is a direct result of one of the following:
  - A current deployment.
  - Military pay error at no fault of the service member.
  - Currently pending a medical discharge due to service-connected injuries/illnesses received while on active duty.

#### Who is not eligible to receive assistance?

- Anyone who has not served in the military, or the financial hardship is caused by one of the following:
  - Misconduct.
  - Civilian, legal, or domestic issues.
  - Issues that are a result of spousal separation or divorce.
  - Financial mismanagement by self or others, or due to bankruptcy.

### What kind of expenses does the Unmet Needs Program assist with?

Unmet Needs assists with any expenses that are classified as "daily necessities," which includes, but is not limited to the following: household expenses such as mortgage, rent, repairs, insurance, vehicle expenses such as payments, repairs, insurance, utilities and primary phone, childcare expenses, and medical bills - the patient's portion for necessary or emergency medical care only.

### What kind of expenses does the Unmet Needs Program not assist with?

Unmet Needs does not assist with any expenses that are not classified as "daily necessities," which includes, but is not limited to the following: military debt/repayment, tuition assistance debt/repayment, credit cards of any kind, cable, internet, secondary phones, taxes owed of any kind, rentals of any kind to include vehicle, furniture, electronics, or any expense not determined to be a "daily necessity."

#### How do I get an application for the Unmet Needs financial grant?

The application can be found online at www.vfw.org/UnmetNeeds, by clicking the "Apply Now" button or the application link under Unmet Needs Resources. (Chrome is recommended for the online application.) Applications cannot be completed unless all required fields are met. Once the application is submitted a notification email will be sent to you with further information.

#### How does the Unmet Needs application process work?

Once an application has been submitted, the Unmet Needs caseworkers review the
application and contacts the applicant if necessary for any additional required
documents or information. All expenses are verified with the creditors. Payments are
sent directly to the creditor to ensure proper disbursement of funds.

## What additional documents are needed for the Unmet Needs Program to process an application?

 All required documents are submitted with the online application and cannot be submitted without them. Depending on the situation, additional documentation may be requested by the Unmet Needs caseworker.

#### How long does the application process take?

 The applications are processed in the order in which they are received. It can take up to 20 business days to process an application once received.

#### What is the normal timeline for helping an individual through Unmet Needs?

The length of time to process a request for assistance depends upon the information
provided on the application and the amount of research conducted. After verification of
the emergency from the service member and contacting creditors, a check is normally
processed within 3 business days and an additional 5-7 business days for mailing of
funds to the creditor.

## 10 Tips for Working with Youth

When working with youth, it is important to consider their safety and needs. We would like to offer these tips and resources so you can ensure that all youth you encounter have the best experience possible.



- Consider taking Youth Protection training. Many organizations working with youth provide and require training. One of the most comprehensive is by the Boy Scouts. You do not need to be a member or even involved with the program in order to take their free online training. Find it here: <a href="http://www.scouting.org/Training/youthprotection.aspx">http://www.scouting.org/Training/youthprotection.aspx</a>
- 2. Always respect the time commitments of youth. They are very busy. Be clear about when an event or project starts and when it ends. Parents also very much appreciate it when their child is finished at the stated time.
- 3. Parents should always be welcome to stay and take part in the activity.
- 4. No matter the project or event, make sure that proper safety measures are taken for everyone involved. Also, be sure that activities or projects are age appropriate.
- 5. Be extremely conscious of the location where you bring or meet the youths.
- 6. Do not smoke, drink or use drugs around them.
- 7. If you are taking youth somewhere other than the Post home or a school, consider asking parents to sign a permission slip and make sure parents understand that the children may be riding in personal vehicles.
- Receive training from your local Child Abuse Prevention Council or Child Protective
  Center on the Mandated Suspected Child Abuse Reporting Laws in your state for those
  working with children.
- Find out if you need to have individuals working with youth/children fingerprinted before events. There may be laws in your state that require background checks.
- 10. Maintain and model healthy boundaries with children be a role model. Remember it is never appropriate to display acts of violence or abuse around or towards children.

Remember that it only takes a minute to make a difference in the life of a child. There are many small, positive things we can all do to help protect and nurture our children that only take a minute. A few words of praise and encouragement to a child, listening carefully to what a child has to say, showing a child you care, are all simple actions that have been shown to have a profound impact on a child's life. In these very real ways, we can all support children and strengthen families.

- Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent residence (the application for which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen.
- Student does not have to be related to a VFW or VFW Auxiliary member to participate.
- Foreign exchange students and students aged 15 or older are ineligible.
- National grade division winners of previous Illustrating America contests may enter the subsequent grade division but are ineligible for the same grade division of which they are a previous national winner.

#### Contest Rules

- Students name, age and grade level must be printed on the back of art submission.
- Entry must be completed during the current school year.
- Entry must be two dimensional.
- Entry must be on canvas or paper.
- Submit canvas entries on a stretcher frame or canvas board.
- Reinforce the back with heavy paper.
- Do not frame art with wood, metal, plastic or glass.
- Mats, including mounted and floating mats, may be used.
- Entries may not be smaller than 8" x 10" and not larger than 18" x 24", INCLUDING mat.
- Watercolor, pencil, pastel, charcoal, tempera, crayon, acrylic, pen, ink, oil, glitter, marker or other media may be
- If the American Flag is used, it **DOES NOT** need to conform to the Federal Flag Code in relation to colors or numbers of stars and stripes.
- Complete contest entry form and submit with art entry.
- Parent or guardian signature required on contest entry form.
- Coloring sheets, digital art and photography and are NOT accepted.


